In addition, SNA integrates the IB Learner Profile, helping students develop essential qualities such as inquiry, open-mindedness, and principled leadership.

ACADEMIC YEAR

The school operates on a quarterly and semester basis. The normal school year consists of two 18-week semesters and students receive ongoing assessments throughout the year.

- In PYP, students will receive a total of four formal reports.
- In MYP, students will receive a total of four formal reports reflecting their performance in each of the eight MYP subjects.
- In DP, students will receive a total of four formal reports reflecting their performance in each subject and progress in the program core.

PRIMARY YEARS PROGRAMME (PYP)

The Primary Years Programme (PYP) is designed for students aged 3 to 12, focusing on a transdisciplinary, inquiry-based, and student-centered curriculum. Instead of learning subjects in isolation, students explore big ideas that connect different disciplines, helping them develop a deeper understanding of the world.

At the heart of the PYP framework is inquiry-based learning, where students ask questions, investigate, and take action. This approach encourages critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving, preparing students to be lifelong learners and global citizens.

The PYP is structured around six transdisciplinary themes, integrating various subjects to make learning more meaningful and relevant:



- · Who We Are
- · Where We Are in Place and Time
- How We Express Ourselves
- · How the World Works
- How We Organize Ourselves
- Sharing the Planet

Assessment in the PYP focuses on student progress and skill development, rather than traditional exams. Teachers use ongoing observations, projects, presentations, and reflections to evaluate learning. Report cards highlight academic achievements, IB learner attributes, and areas for growth.

At SNA, we believe that academic success is a collaboration between parents and teachers. We encourage parents to review report cards with their child to discuss study habits, preparedness, behavior, and classroom engagement. Open communication helps students understand expectations and work towards growth.

MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME (MYP)

The Middle Years Programme (MYP) is designed for students aged 11 to 16, bridging the gap between the inquiry-based learning of the PYP and the rigorous academic demands of the DP. The MYP emphasizes conceptual understanding, interdisciplinary learning, and real-world application, helping students develop into independent, creative, and globally-minded learners.

The MYP is structured around eight subject groups, ensuring a broad and balanced education:



- · Language & Literature
- · Language Acquisition
- · Individuals & Societies
- Sciences
- Mathematics
- Arts
- Physical & Health Education
- Design

MYP students learn through inquiry and conceptual exploration, developing a deeper understanding of how knowledge applies to real-world contexts. The curriculum encourages students to:

- Think critically by exploring global and local issues.
- Engage in service learning through meaningful community projects.
- Develop personal and academic skills with the Approaches to Learning (ATL) framework.

Assessment in the MYP is continuous and growth-focused, rather than based on final exams. Each subject is assessed using four IB criteria, with scores ranging from 0 to 8 per criterion. The final score (out of 32) determines the IB grade (1-7 scale).

Teachers provide formative feedback throughout the learning process, helping students track progress, reflect on their learning, and improve over time. Summative assessments evaluate student understanding through projects, presentations, essays, and problem-solving tasks.

MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME (MYP)

The IB Diploma Programme (DP) is a challenging, two-year pre-university program for students aged 16 to 19, designed to develop academic excellence, critical thinking, and international-mindedness. Recognized by universities worldwide, the DP equips students with the skills, knowledge, and resilience needed for success in higher education and beyond.

Students take six subjects, choosing one from each of the following groups:

- · Studies in Language & Literature
- · Language Acquisition
- · Individuals & Societies
- Sciences
- Mathematics
- The Arts (or an additional subject from another group)

Subjects are taken at Higher Level (HL) or Standard Level (SL), allowing students to specialize while maintaining a well-rounded education.

Beyond subject coursework, students complete the DP Core, which enhances academic depth and real-world engagement:

- Theory of Knowledge (TOK): Explores the nature of knowledge and critical thinking.
- Extended Essay (EE): A 4,000-word independent research project that develops analytical and writing skills
- Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS): Encourages personal growth and social responsibility through extracurricular projects.

The DP encourages inquiry, debate, and deep exploration, preparing students for the demands of university-level study. Students develop:

- · Advanced research and writing skills through the EE.
- Critical thinking and interdisciplinary understanding in TOK.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ A well-rounded perspective by balancing academics with CAS activities.

The DP is assessed through both internal and external evaluations:

- Internal Assessments (IAs) include research papers, presentations, and lab work, graded by teachers and moderated by the IB.
- External Assessments include IB exams at the end of the program, graded by international examiners.

Each subject is graded on a 1-7 scale, with up to 3 additional points from TOK and EE, making a maximum possible score of 45. To earn the IB Diploma, students must achieve at least 24 points and meet all DP requirements.

Beyond academics and sports, students can join STEM, debate, language, and creative arts clubs, ensuring a well-rounded educational experience. These activities help students build confidence, collaboration, and perseverance, equipping them with essential skills for future success.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

At SNA, we believe that every student deserves to feel safe, supported, and included in all aspects of school life. Our Student Support Services are designed to take care of students' academic, emotional, and physical well-being, so they can focus on learning, growing, and enjoying their school journey.

Transportation Service

We offer a daily bus service that covers a wide range of routes across Ho Chi Minh City. Our school buses are well-maintained, air-conditioned, and equipped with seat belts. Each ride is supervised by a trained bus monitor to ensure that students travel safely and comfortably between home and school. Parents can rest assured knowing their child is in good hands during every journey.

Child Protection and Safeguarding

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIPS

SNA believes that learning extends beyond the classroom, and field trips provide students with hands-on experiences that enrich their academic understanding. These trips are carefully designed to align with the IB curriculum and develop real-world connections to classroom learning.

Students have visited:

- Museums and Historical Sites Deepening their understanding of Vietnamese and global history.
- Science & Innovation Centers Exploring STEM concepts through hands-on experiments and interactive exhibits.
- Cultural Immersion Trips Encouraging global perspectives through exchanges and collaborations with other international schools.
- Outdoor Adventure & Leadership Camps Building teamwork, resilience, and leadership skills in nature-based learning environments.

A highlight of the year is Week Without Walls (WWW), where PYP, MYP, and DP students travel across Vietnam for multi-day trips. These immersive experiences promote independence, critical thinking, and service learning, preparing students for life beyond school.

BOARDING HOUSE

Boarding students at SNA have a unique student experience, able to enrich their learning journey while participating in fun activities designed to boost social engagement and character development. Choosing to attend a boarding school means accepting some major lifestyle changes. SNA's boarding program serves to educationally and socially prepare students for life after graduation, and students receive valuable support and guidance that helps them become more confident and successful.

STUDENT BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

We promote positive discipline, where students take responsibility for their choices and actions through restorative practices. At the start of each year, students collaborate to establish behavioral norms, ensuring a safe, respectful, and productive learning environment. The school emphasizes "Attending" as a guiding principle to reinforce positive behavior.

Students are expected to uphold school policies, respect facilities, and follow staff guidance, including teachers, administrative staff, and support personnel. Key expectations include:

- · Attending school consistently and punctually.
- Using phones only under staff supervision between 7:50 a.m. 3:30 p.m.
- Demonstrating politeness, honesty, and courtesy at all times.
- Speaking English during the academic day, except during breaks.
- · Avoiding inappropriate language or gestures.
- Keeping personal spaces, including lockers, clean and organized.
- · Modeling the IB Learner Profile attributes.

Personal valuables brought to campus are the student's responsibility, and they are advised to avoid bringing large sums of money or expensive items.

DRESS CODE REGULATIONS

Each student is responsible for displaying respect and pride for themselves and for others through appropriate dress. Students must wear the required SNA uniform Monday – Friday. Students must dress in accordance with the established guidelines when they are on school property or during school-led excursions.









ANNUAL EVENTS

PATHWAYS TO WORLD' TOP UNIVERSITIES (PTU) INTENSIVE COACHING PROGRAM

Only at SNA, this intensive coaching program is designed to guide students from grade 9 to grade 12 through the university application process, ensuring they make informed decisions about their future. Through personalized counseling, workshops, and mentoring, students receive comprehensive support in preparing for top universities worldwide.

Grade 10: Narrowing Career Interests and Early University Awareness Identify career paths and align academics with university goals.

Grade 11: University and Career Preparation


